## **Airport**

San Antonio International Airport (SAT) is served by 12 airlines and 14 onsite car rental agencies 260 is average daily and international flights (departures and arrivals)

Reaching nearly 9 million passengers in 2018

A new car rental facility was opened in 2018

Non-Stop to 53 destinations

International flights are served by Aeromexico, Interjet, Aeromar and now (Southwest) to Mexico City, Monterrey and Cancun, plus Volaris and Air Canada (with daily non-stop flights to Toronto)



#### Hotels

### **Visitors**

San Antonio's travel & tourism industry attracts more than 29.7 million visitors annually to Bexar County, and over 34.4 million visitors to the region (includes day & night visitors and conventions and leisure).

#### **General Stats**

San Antonio MLS \$157,900 (median price home) (Texas \$151,600)

Over 12 Universities in the San Antonio area with Alamo Colleges being the largest in student population and the University of Texas in San Antonio growing very rapidly (UTSA).

Programs in Tourism and Culinary studies are available at St. Philip's College and UTSA.

There are 16 schools districts in the area with Northside and Northeast being the largest enrollment.



#### **Hotel Tax**

16.75% is the hotel tax collected in San Antonio (7% stays in City revenues, 2% for convention center improvements, state keeps 6% and county keeps 1.75%) The HOT is regulated by state law.

The hotel tax (HOT) supports the following departments in the City of San Antonio: Convention Center and Alamodome, portions or Parks and Recreation dealing with Riverwalk maintenance and preservation, International Affairs and Cultural Affairs, plus Visit San Antonio, who promotes conventions and markets San Antonio as a destination.



#### Sales Tax

Sales tax collection for San Antonio grew from \$157,351,053.98 (2010) to \$165,681,067.02 in YTD 2011.

The City of San Antonio collected just over \$51.1 million in sales taxes from hospitality businesses.



#### Attractions

San Antonio is a unique city which has over 20 Attractions and home to Six Flags Fiesta Texas and SeaWorld. In addition, we have many attractions for families to enjoy including Extreme Escape, Buckhorn Museum, Witte Museum, Ripley's Believe it or Not, Splashtown, San Antonio ZOO, Natural Bridge Caverns, Natural Bridge Wildlife Ranch, Ripley's Haunted Adventure, Tomb Rider 3D, Guiness World Records, Schlitterbahn, Doseum, Louis Tussaud's Wax Works and under construction is Lego Learning Center and SeaLife Aquarium.
